1. Welcome

The meeting began at 4:35 p.m. Chair Kyle Roche welcomed the members of the Central Davis Community Council (CDCC). Chair Roche welcomed visitor Kathleen Chronister the Davis School District Director of Social and Emotional Learning.

Dr. Hawthorne took notes for the District. Chronister introduced the Davis Learner Profiles which will help "provide targeted outcomes for future work in curriculum, social-emotional learning, professional development, and personalize, competency-based learning." Central Davis Junior High Community Council was asked to provide suggestions and ideas that would apply to the "Profile of a 9th Grade Student" in the area of communication. Chronister presented questions to the CDCC and the CDCC members responded. Chronister thanked the CDCC for their time and suggestions.

Chair Roche turned the time over to Dr. Lori Hawthorne to provide a current accounting of the LAND Trust funds. Dr. Hawthorne provided clarification as it was needed.

5. Intro to 2021-22 SIP/Funding

Chair Roche explained that the allocation amount from LAND Trust to Central Davis Junior High for the 2021-2022 school year has not yet been released. He also explained the role of the CDCC in determining goals and expenditures. Teachers are able to submit applications to receive grants. Chair Roche turned the time over to Dr. Hawthorne to introduce the administration's 2021-2022 LAND Trust funding requests. Dr. Hawthorne presented the general funding requests and answered questions. Dr. Hawthorne explained the requests and need for a bilingual parent liaison. Teacher- Member Spencer Hadlock added his experiences as to why this position would be necessary. Dr. Hawthorne explained that in May 2020 the Davis School District determined that due to the unprecedented need for students to be one to one with devices in the 2020-2021 school year, CDJH received their 2020-2021 electronics money early. There are still funding needs, but much less than in previous years. Teacher grant requests were distributed to CDCC members but will be discussed at the February meeting. Due to not having the allocation amount, it was decided to postpone discussion until the next meeting. Dr. Hawthorne explained to the CDCC members that due to enrollment being down, the allocation would likely be smaller than it has been in the past several years. Enrollment has dropped below 850 students; traditionally enrollment has been around 1,000 students. Goals will be presented at the February meeting.
